

NOTICE OF PUBLIC MEETING

(Under the Planning Act)**

Request to Amend the Official Plan Application No. 17 139916 NNY 26 OZ

Location of Application: Lands located along the south side of Eglinton Avenue East, east of Laird Drive, north of Vanderhoof Avenue, and west of Aerodrome Crescent. Also, lands generally along the west side of Laird Drive between Vanderhoof Avenue and south to Millwood Road.

Applicant: City Initiated

PROPOSAL

The purpose of this Official Plan Amendment is to bring forward the Laird in Focus Draft Site and Area Specific Policy (SASP). The SASP represents a series of policies that reflect the outcomes of a comprehensive planning study for the lands in the vicinity of Laird Drive and Eglinton Avenue East. The SASP provides for a planning framework to accommodate future population and job growth around the Eglinton Crosstown Light Rail Transit Station, address transportation and servicing issues, and create a complete, mixed-use community, including a variety of built form and a new connected network of streets, parks and open spaces.


FURTHER INFORMATION

If you wish to be notified of the decision of the City of Toronto on the proposed Official Plan Amendment, you must make a written request to the City Clerk Attention: Francine Adamo, Administrator, North York Community Council, at the address, fax number or e-mail set out in this notice.

Official Plan Amendment Appeal: If a person or public body would otherwise have an ability to appeal the decision of the Council of the City of Toronto to the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal but the person or public body does not make oral submissions at a public meeting or make written submissions to the City of Toronto before the proposed Official Plan Amendment is adopted or refused, the person or public body is not entitled to appeal the decision and may not be added as a party to the hearing of an appeal before the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal unless, in the opinion of the Tribunal there are reasonable grounds to do so. You may submit comments to the City Clerk, Attention: Francine Adamo, Administrator, North York Community Council, at the address, fax number or e-mail set out in this notice.

People writing or making presentations at the public meeting: The *City of Toronto Act, 2006*, the *Planning Act*, and the City of Toronto Municipal Code authorize the City of Toronto to collect any personal information in your communication or presentation to City Council or its committees.

The City collects this information to enable it to make informed decisions on the relevant issue(s). If you are submitting letters, faxes, e-mails, presentations or other communications to the City, you should be aware that your name and the fact that you communicated with the City will become part of the public record and will appear on the City's website.
